

MESSAGE FROM The president



We were very busy in 2018 working on Year one of our 2018-2020 strategic plan.

I am very pleased that our new name and logo, introduced at the end of 2017, have been quickly adopted by our members and stakeholders and that our new vision for the future has received strong support from our constituency.

The Canadian Association for Interventional Radiology (CAIR) is more than ever determined to raise awareness about Interventional Radiology (IR) treatments and to lift the hurdles that stand in the way of better access for Canadians to the benefits that IR treatments can provide.

The *CAIR Initiative*, launched in the winter of 2018, aims to inform patients about alternatives to surgery, such as uterine fibroid embolization or chemoembolization of cancerous tumours. It also aims to get decision makers to realize the cost-effectiveness of IR treatments.

The CAIR introduced its new website in 2018. The website remains a helpful resource for health professionals working in the field of IR, but it now has enhanced sections intended for patients. As an example, new educational videos appear on the website. They are designed to help patients understand common IR treatments and to provide them with the information they need to seek noninvasive IR treatments as they navigate the healthcare system. In the fall of 2018, the CAIR launched a membership drive under the theme *There has never been a better time to join CAIR*. We have since recruited new members and reactivated the membership of many others.

The majority of Interventional Radiologists working in Canada already belong to the CAIR. But a growing number of those who don't are realizing the value of the new benefits that the CAIR now offers, in particular all the benefits of membership with the CIRSE (Cardiovascular and Interventional Radiological Society of Europe) and a one-stop shop for all the CME credits they need (sections 1, 2 and 3). The CAIR is now a group member of CIRSE and physicians enrolled with the CAIR automatically enjoy the numerous benefits of CIRSE, which include access to remarkable online professional development resources. Furthermore, members who attend the CAIR Annual Meeting now have the opportunity to gain section 2 credits through our new self-assessment program.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION NO. 1

Plan, develop and lead the CAIR Initiative for patient friendly, interventional radiology treatments.

The CAIR Initiative is a multi-stakeholder endeavor aimed at making patient friendly, minimally invasive, interventional radiology (IR) treatments widely accessible to Canadian patients.

The CAIR Initiative will be implemented through a number of actions, including:

- Raise awareness about IR amongst target audiences.
- Influence decision-makers to make IR treatments more accessible to Canadians.
- Team up with other professional associations and with patient groups to promote the benefits of IR treatments.
- Maintain regular media relations and public relations to raise awareness about patient friendly IR treatments.
- · Showcase testimonials of patients who can speak about the benefits of IR treatments.
- Bestow awards to recognize the achievements of outstanding Interventional Radiologists and of hospitals that have provided extraordinary leadership in making IR treatments accessible to patients.
- Create a new corporate identity through a new name and logo:

STRATEGIC DIRECTION NO. 2

- Provide members with an opportunity to obtain all required CME credits for the Royal College
 MOCOMP program
- · Continue to provide members with outstanding continuing professional development activities.
- Maintain the Association's quarterly newsletter and community forum as well as the ongoing circulation of clinical cases.

Ensure the Association's financial sustainability and growth

The Association's income is mainly based on membership fees, revenue from events and support from corporate partners. Additional sources of income are required to ensure sustainability and growth.

The Association will take measures to generate new revenue, including:
