Having just completed second year as Executive Director of CAIR, I continue to be impressed by the passion and ability demonstrated by our team and our board of directors. Everyone has shown a unity of vision to advance CAIR's mission — centred on our members, allies, partners, and other stakeholders — through a time of great challenges for all healthcare professionals. We remain strong because of you.

We have done more than tested our mettle in the past year; we have amplified the value we deliver to members and stakeholders. 




